Giving Back to the Dallas Community

Highlights from the 2022 Community Grants

In 2022, DCF awarded nearly \$50,000 in grants to local non-profit organizations addressing a variety of causes and needs, enriching the Dallas community. Here are a few highlights of the broad impact the Foundation has made.



One of the significant challenges in Dallas this year was food insecurity. DCF grants helped to ensure no one in Dallas should go hungry. The volunteers at Dallas Food Bank know firsthand the effects of rising food prices on family budgets. This year they are serving an increasing number of new families. With DCF funds, the food bank supplemented food boxes with protein-enriched foods and personal hygiene items.

James 2 Community Kitchen has also seen a large increase in demand for the community dinner program, serving upwards



of 250 meals a week. DCF funds provided equipment to increase food storage and aid in meal preparation. Cost savings and the flexibility of DCF funds enabled the program to purchase additional food and togo containers.

Despite the cold and rainy spring that delayed the season, Dallas Youth Garden interns provided a small, but important harvest of fresh produce for those in need. With DCF support since 2014, over 37,000 pounds of fresh produce have been harvested for food programs. This year's group of interns also gained some insight into the challenges of growing food when mother nature doesn't cooperate!

DCF funds supported the health and well-being of vulnerable populations through the Polk Community Free Clinic. A patient writes, "It's always so good to come to the PCFC. I like that you have interpreters to help me with my appointment and also to pray for me. Thank you for being here for people like me, and for being open on Saturdays, when I don't work."

DCF funds gave hope and help to families in need, through grant recipients like Family Building Blocks. A Dallas mother and her child struggled with the loss of the

In partnership with the Dallas Education Foundation, DCF supported the small grants program for educators in the Dallas School District. From sensory swings, Apple super drives and scooter boards to choir risers, scientific calculators, and fetal pigs for dissection, to reset room supplies and transportation for an Oregon Symphony field trip, a diverse group of students will benefit in positive and amazing ways. 📂
